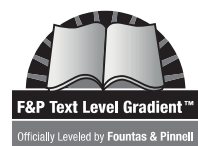

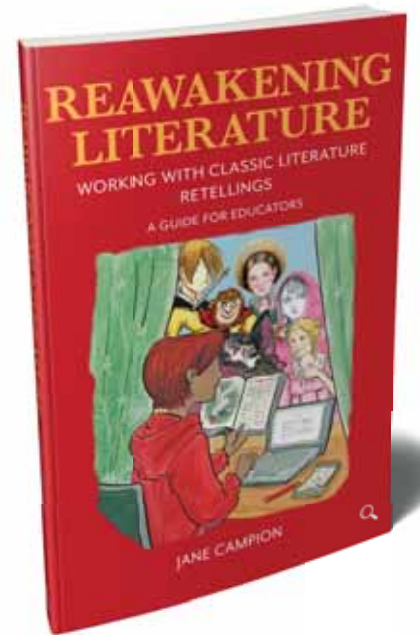

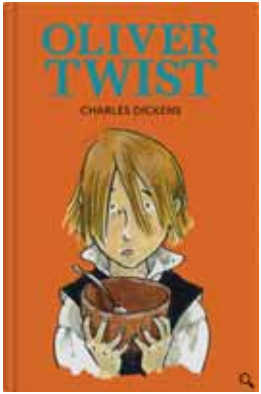
SUCCESS IN THE CLASSROOM

"At Cottenham Primary School we have been using Real Reads books in our Upper Key Stage Two classrooms for the last year. We wanted our children to have the opportunity to explore classic texts at an age appropriate level, so that they could enjoy the story and broaden their reading repertoire.
